

Permaculture Design Certificate Course

Course Outline

The course will cover the background knowledge, design skills and practical techniques of the Permaculture Institute's 72-hour Permaculture Design Certificate Course. This PDC course will run over a full year, giving participants plenty of time to absorb the concepts, develop designs, and relate the ideas to the real world.

The course involves one night per week during school terms and several trips to develop on-site design skills. Designs will be developed to cover the range of situations a designer might meet. This will include backyard town/urban/suburban planning, larger semi-rural acreage, and broadacre farm design and community planning.

The 38 week course covers

- Principles and Ethics of Permaculture
- The Cultivated Ecology
- Designing Productive Landscapes
- Sustainability and Productivity
- Permaculture in Social Context
- + Practical Organic Gardening Techniques

Graduates are entitled to the Permaculture Design Certificate from the Southern Highlands Permaculture Institute.

Course Presenters

David Johnson enjoys a balancing act between part-time teaching, PC design, web design, music and earthier pursuits on his property at Penrose. David, with a Science background, did his PDC in 1990 and has recently been awarded the Permaculture Diploma in Education and Media.

Jill Cockram lives in Exeter where she puts permaculture theory into practice on her one third acre site. An inspiration to visit, it is a highly regarded destination for permaculture tours. Jill completed her PDC with David Holmgren (1997). She is active in CANWIN and the Moss Vale Community Garden.

Debbie Hebbard is a mainstay of Permaculture Southern Highlands where she runs the seed bank. She gained her PDC in 1998 and has been a regular contributor to the course since then, specialising in the hands on activities. She coordinated the very successful SeedSavers Conference in 2004 and now manages the kitchen garden at Berrima Public School.

Tim Flaus is a high school science teacher who lives in Moss Vale where he tries out permaculture ideas in the garden. He did his PDC with the Southern Highlands team in 2009.

Course Fees

The full cost of the course is \$600.

A deposit of \$100 is required to secure a place. (This is not refundable unless the course is cancelled or at least two weeks notice is given)

A generous \$50 discount is available for full payment at the beginning of the course.

Payments can be made easier by an initial payment (after \$100 deposit) of \$200 and two further instalments of \$150 at the start of terms 2 and 3.

An alternative payment plan can be arranged to suit individual circumstances.

The Design Manual by Bill Mollison is the essential textbook for the course. It is available for \$75 (\$105rrp!). Please indicate on the application if you require a copy.

Other concessions for the course are available, for households, pensioners, unemployed, etc. Please ring or email for details.

Please note that the course will only be run if there are sufficient participants. Your help in recruiting students would be appreciated.

The class size is limited to a maximum of 18, to encourage participation and facilitate learning.

Application deadline is Friday 20th January 2012

What is Permaculture?

"Permaculture is a philosophy which seeks to offer practical strategies for sustainable living. It links notions from the social justice and environment movements. It provides the practice for community-based Ecologically Sustainable Development. Permaculture was first articulated in Australia in the late 1970's and is now a world-wide movement with local groups in most countries of the world. The concepts of permaculture have been developed around a set of ethics and design principles."
